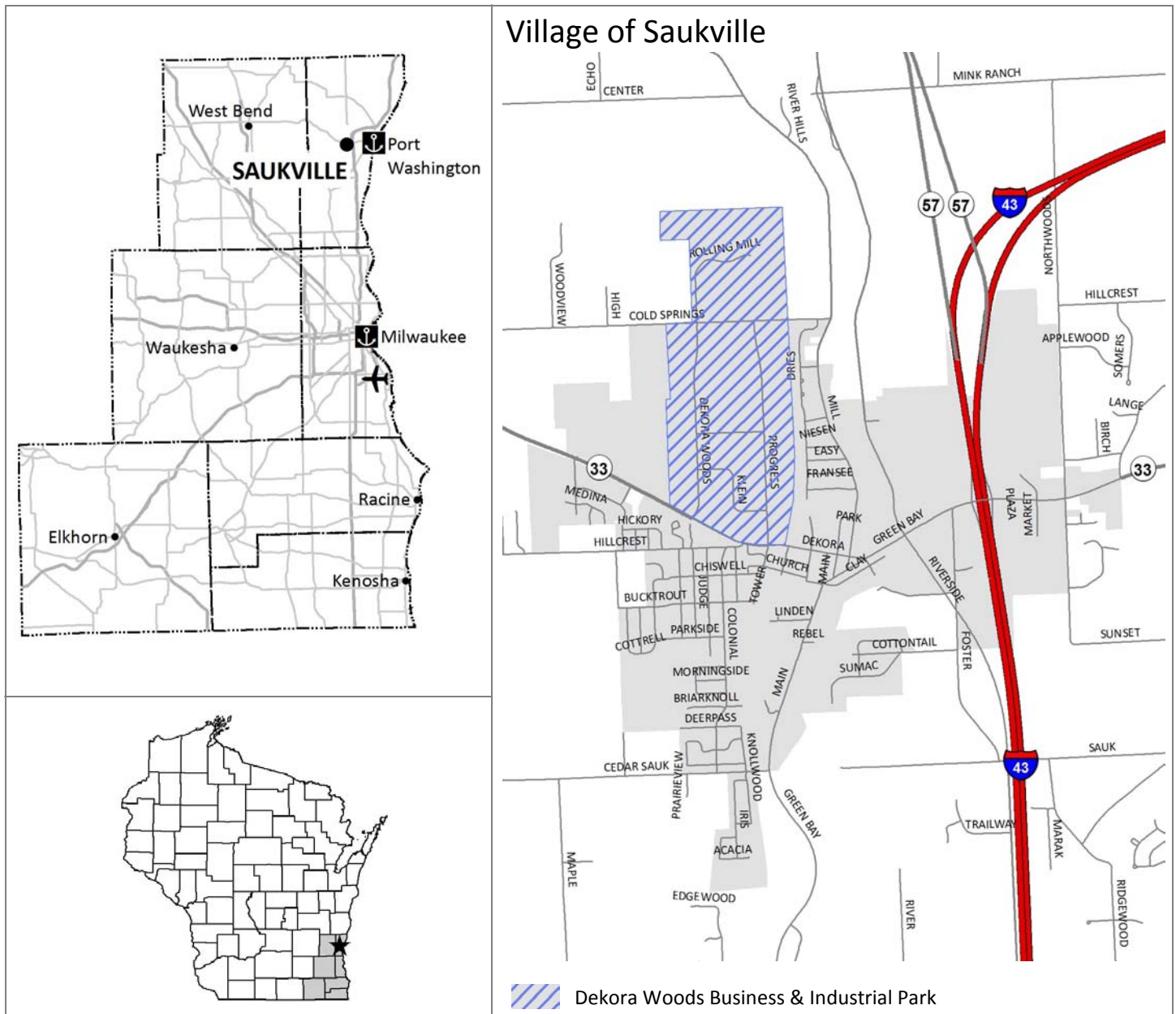

Amenities

Saukville is home to many neighborhood parks, recreational activities, and community events. Nearby golf courses include The Bog, Fire Ridge, Hawthorne Hills, Edgewater, and Tendick Park, an 18-hole disc golf course. Local parks include Grady, Peninsula, Quade, West Riverside, Veterans, Schowalter, East Riverside, and Friendship Park.

Other attractions include Riveredge Nature Center, the Cedarburg Bog, nature trails, a Milwaukee River canoe launch, and the 30-mile Ozaukee Interurban Trail.

Community events include Sunday Farmers' Markets, Live at the Triangle Free Summer Concert Series, July 4th events, National Night Out, Saukville Car Show, Chamber 5K Run/Walk, and Christmas Tree Lighting.
