Multi-Use Trail

The Ozaukee Interurban Trail, a 30-mile paved trail, the majority of which is off-road, runs through the Town of Port Washington and provides opportunities for biking, in-line skating, walking, running, and cross-country skiing.

The Town of Port Washington, located north and west of the City of Port Washington, is a rural community that enjoys the beauty of its Lake Michigan shoreland, woodland, and farmland.

Interstate Highway 43 provides easy access to Milwaukee, Sheboygan, and Green Bay.

Recreational opportunities include the Ozaukee Interurban Trail, which runs through the Town and nearby Harrington Beach State Park to the north.
