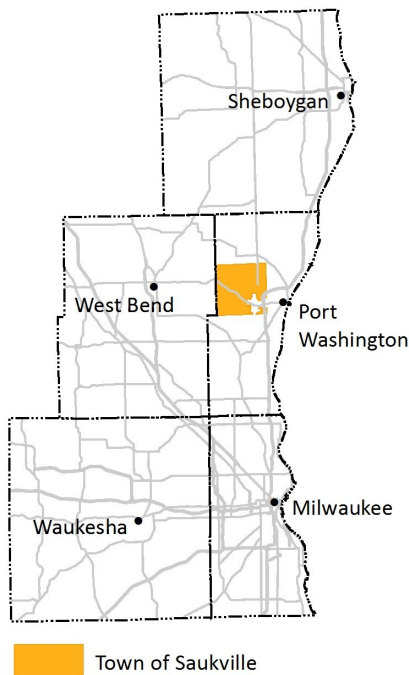

Multi-Use Trail

The Ozaukee Interurban Trail, a 30-mile paved trail, the majority of which is off-road, runs near the Town of Saukville and provides opportunities for biking, in-line skating, walking, running, and cross-country skiing.

Air

Commercial airline service is available at:

- Milwaukee's General Mitchell International Airport (34 miles south)
- Chicago's O'Hare International Airport (110 miles south)

Rail

Area rail freight service is provided by Canadian National Railway. Passenger rail service, provided by Amtrak, is available at the Milwaukee Intermodal Station, 25 miles south.

Water

- Port Washington Marina: 3 miles east
- Port of Milwaukee: 26 miles south

Amenities

Located just three miles inland from Lake Michigan and 15 miles north of Milwaukee, the Town offers spectacular views of rural landscapes, and small town atmosphere. The Town of Saukville is primarily rural with about 1,800 citizens spread over 36 square miles.

One of six townships in Ozaukee County, Town of Saukville residents are proud of our strong school districts, safe environment, and efficient town government services. Within our borders are many recreational opportunities, as well as natural geographic features like the Cedarburg Bog and Milwaukee River.
